Immaculate Parish KINDERGARTEN OPENS

Doors of the Immaculate Conception School were thrown open on Tuesday morning to welcome the many youngsters returning from their summer vacations. The children assembled in the church at 8:30 and assisted at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, which marked the official opening of school. After Mass, Mgr. Small art easels have been provided for each child and all sorts of constructive toys and games have been provided for the use of the class. This kindergarten has the most modern equipment obtainable and it is expected that this will fill a need long felt in the parish.

The regular Thursday night parties were again resumed on last Thursday evening. Excellent prizes are being offered and new equipment has been obtained which makes the game speedier and more enjoyable. It is hoped that many of the parishioners will turn out for these parties.

Brothers of Mercy Invite Young Men To Learn of Work

(Following information has been sent to the ATHLETIC CLUB for young men, 17 to 25 years of age, who have intentions of joining the Brothers of Mercy.)

The first foundation of the Brothers of Mercy F.M.M. for the care of the sick and other charitable work for the relief of spiritual and physical misery was made in the United States in 1924. At Buffalo it developed quickly with the help of God from small beginnings to the present day foundation. In order to give American boys a chance to enter the charitable institution of the Brothers of Mercy the Brothers erected in 1926 with the approval of Rome a Novitiate at Buffalo. At present there are four Novices and three Postulants preparing for the noble work of nursing, while also taking a course of instruction in the Red Cross Society.

Young men who have reached their seventeenth year are accepted. The time of probation lasts six months. After completion of this half year the postulants receive the Habit providing they show signs of a true vocation. The young Brothers remain two years in the Novitiate where they receive their religious training and continue their course in nursing. After completion of the Novitiate the young Brothers may pronounce their vows for one year.
