Food Facts Given Teachers As Health Defense Aid

Nutrition information supplementing health education material provided teachers in the Catholic schools of the Rochester diocese during the past three years by the Tuberculosis and Health Association was distributed to elementary school teachers attending the 5th annual Teachers' Institute at Aquinas Institute, Friday.

Explaining that emphasis would be given to facts about food as part of the health program for national defense and that instruction given in schools would be part of the weekly hygiene lesson, Joseph P. MacSweeney, President of the Tuberculosis and Health Association, stated that the material included six vitamin lessons. The lessons stated Mr. MacSweeney contained historical stories, illustrating the development of the knowledge on nutrition, facts related to diet and eyes, and heat sources of vitamins A, B, C, D and G. They are intended to vitalize classroom instruction as part of a program developed with the approval of Rev. John M. Duffy, superintendent of Catholic schools.
