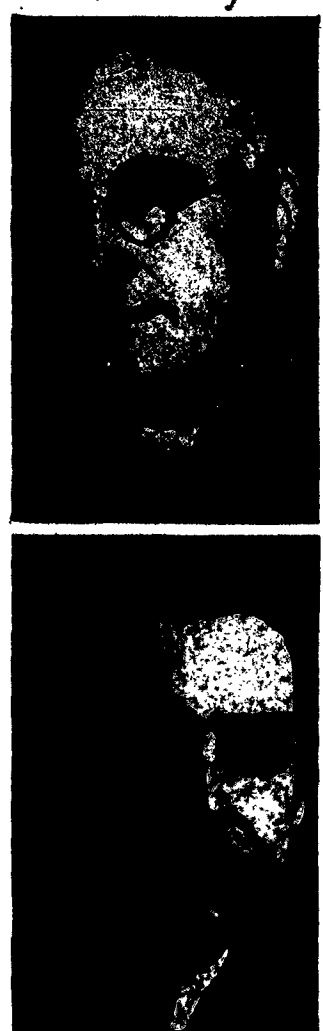
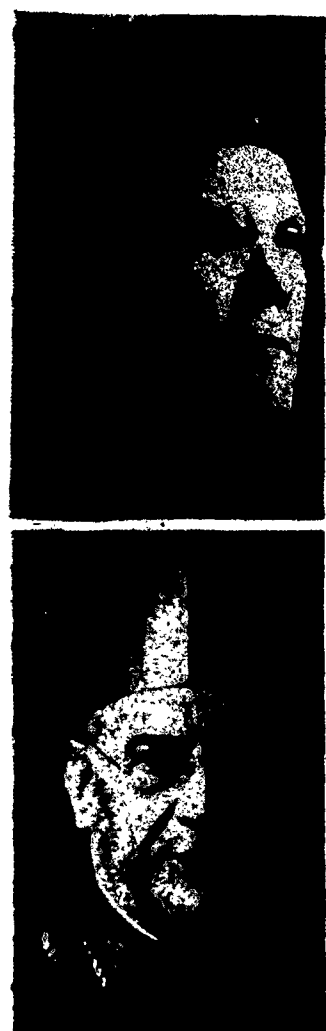

German Prelate Warns Gestapo Methods Will Ruin Fatherland

His Protests Ignored, Bishop In Sermon Hits False Arrests

LISBON—(N. C.)—High-handed flaunting of the judicial processes by the Gestapo, a course of action which it permitted to continue "will lead our German people and our country to ruin," was vigorously condemned by the Most Rev. Clemens August Count von Galen, Bishop of Munster, in a group of documents which have become available here.

Gestapo Acts Draw Bishop's Protest

Text of Correspondence Between Bishop Von Galen and Nazi Reich Minister

LISBON—(N. C.)—Herewith are presented three amazing documents of complicity correspondence between the Most Rev. Clemens August Count von Galen, Bishop of Munster, Germany, and Dr. Lammers, Minister of the Reich and Chief of the Reich Chancellery, in which the prelate denounced the persecutory methods employed by the Gestapo and the Nazi official made known that the protest had been called to the attention of the head of the very organization against which it was judged.

FDR Reveals Religion Move For Russia

Many Protests on Comparison With U. S. Freedom Bring Declaration

WASHINGTON—(N. C.)—The revelation by President Roosevelt that he has instructed United States representatives in Moscow to take up the question of religious freedom in Soviet Russia came in the midst of a tidal wave of protest, which, for its intensity and immediacy, amazed observers in the National Capital.

Code, for the past five years a member of the faculty of the Catholic University of America, as Chaplain of the Imperial House of Austria. Dr. Code belongs to the Diocese of Davenport.
