2,923 Memberships Put CYA Drive Over Top

Hailing the 2,923 memberships secured, 423 over the quota, jubilant workers in the Columbus Youth Association campaign, which closed Monday night figuratively "tore down the goal post" in celebration. For team captains: Carl P. Smith, Rochester, reported 318; Joseph L. Hockenro, Niagara, 193; T. Chester Heisch, Fordham, 184; and T. Harold McCann, Notre-Dame, 216. Special Committee Chairman Swartz reported a total of 923 members. Leading the individual campaigners was Mrs. Charles Howe.
