**People Should Concern  
Themselves With Youth  
In Camps Avers Verein**

Importance of citizens generally interesting themselves in the conditions prevailing in the armed forces of the country, was impressed upon members of Rochester Branch, Catholic Central Verein of America meeting Sunday at St. Joseph's Hall.

The members were discussing the resolution on Catholic Young Men and National Defense which was adopted at the National Convention of the organization held this year.

That part of the resolution recommending that all Catholic young men who have been called into the service contact immediately the Catholic chaplain and make themselves acquainted with him was emphasized.

Stress was laid upon the importance of corresponding frequently and regularly with the young men in camps. Too much emphasis, it was pointed out, cannot be laid on this very necessary practice.

Coordination urged.

In connection with the discussion of this resolution William Wittman gave an interesting description of the work done by the Kolping Society in Germany when he was a young man. He pointed out the importance of coordination in the work among the youth. The various societies worked independently and through a central agency coordinated their efforts. He pointed out that the importance of coordination was made clear at the national and international congresses of youth that were held from time to time. Through an interchange of ideas as to plans and methods the various societies were greatly aided in their work in their respective localities.

During the discussion the matter of the attendance of high school pupils in the religious classes was taken up. The delegates were urged to do all in their power to make the plan successful.

**Labor College to Open**

President William J. Fuchrer outlined the plan for this year of the Catholic Labor College which will reopen on Friday, October 24, at the Catholic Worker House of Hospitality on South Avenue. He asked the members to attend in as large numbers as possible.

President Fuchrer also announced that in the near future a third regional conference of the New York State Branch, Catholic Central Verein of America, will take place at Buffalo, N. Y.

A special meeting of the Men's and Women's Branches will be held on Friday evening, Nov. 7, in St. Joseph's Hall. At this meeting the national resolution entitled "Peace" will be the subject of discussion. In this connection it will be well to consult the Five Point Peace Program of Pope Pius XII around which the national resolution was written.

Harry DeLoach told of the efforts being put forth in regard to the establishment and running of the cooperative grocery in the north-east part of Rochester. He stated that the results obtained are a striking example of what can be done by group action working for the common good.

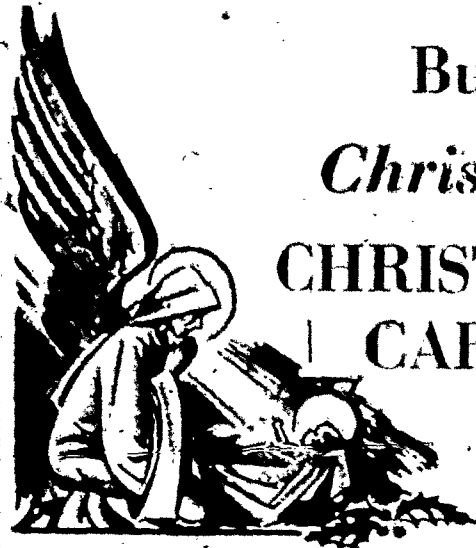
