The progressive educational methods and technique of teaching now in use in many American schools are as preposterous as the traditional methods were and is the belief of Dr. Mortimer J. Adler, author of "How to Read a Book," University of Chicago professor and one of the country's outstanding educational philosophers who will speak here Sunday evening Oct. 26.

Dr. Adler will be heard at Aquinas Institute Auditorium, Dewey Ave. as the second speaker in the Christian Culture Lecture Series. The lecture begins at 8:30 P. M. to be followed by a question and answer period.

One of the outstanding leaders in the new plan of college instruction put into operation at the University of Chicago by President Hutchins Dr. Adler takes a middle course in the current controversy between the progressives and the classicists.

"Classicism he defines as 'the art and empty formalism which dominated education at the end of the last century. It emphasized, he says, the study of the classics, for historical reasons it was interested in the past for the past's sake, and it mistook drill for discipline. Today's progressivism is, however, he believes, an equally unfortunate extreme.

Progressivism has become 'so absorbed with the study of the contemporary world that it forgets human culture has traditional roots,' he states. "It has substituted information for understanding, and science for wisdom. It has mistaken license for liberty, for that is what freedom is when it is unaccompanied by discipline."

Dr. Adler's views on many issues before this country and the world today will be reflected in his lecture here the subject of which is "The Demonstration of Democracy."

General admission to the lecture this Sunday is 50 cents plus tax. Reserved section seats may be secured by phoning Greenwood 75 or Stone 4974.
