'Martin De Porres House' Opens Nov. 9

Saw, lumber and paint trailers are being worked at top speed for the opening of the Martin de Porres House on Clarissa Street on Nov. 9. The opening of the house, which is sponsored by the Clergy Veteran Unit of the Catholic Students Mission Crusade, expects to draw members of the clergy, parents and friends of the workers, and many of the colored people whom the house is planned to help.

To be used as a center for its work among the Negroes of the Third Ward, the unit purchased the house in August. Already some work had been done in private homes and among the established Catholic families. Renovation of the dilapidated house was begun early in September under the direction of Vice-president Bob Finegan.

Volunteer workers of the unit have shingled the exterior and prepared the inside for painting and decorating. The floors are to be refinished and a suitable lighting system installed. So far no professional help has been needed; the members doing all the work in their spare time.

Rita Conley, one of the unit's charter members and general chairman of the C. S. M. C. convention held here in June, has received recognition as having done the most outstanding mission work in the past year. It was announced recently at Crusade Headquarters.

Attending a long record of faithful Catholic lay activity, Dr. Frederick H. Goddard, practicing physician for 34 years here, was honored in death by many Catholic organizations he served.

Dr. Goddard died Oct. 12 at the age of 53 years.

Funeral services were held from his home 60 Edmonds St. and at Blessed Sacrament Church, Oct. 16. Solemn Mass of Requiem was offered by the Rev. George J. Schmitt with the Rev. John S. Mahoney, Bracon and the Rev. W. Hugh Sabbe as officiating.

He was also a member of Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, K. of C. the American Legion and other organizations.
