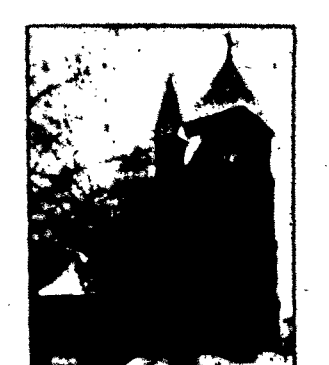
I am sure that the Sisters will be delighted with your sacrifice money and all they ask of you is a little prayer for the success of their work.

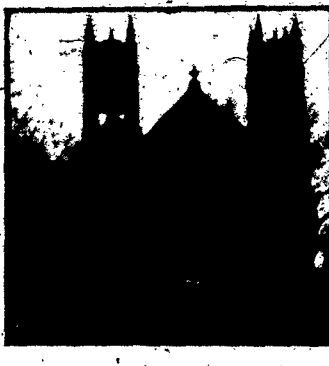
