'FUTURES' TRADING CITED AS CAUSE OF FARM DISTRESS

WASHINGTON The dire effects on farm economy of the practice of commodities "futures" trading is stressed in an introduction by the Rev. Dr. Edgar Schmiedeler, OSB, Director of the Family Life Bureau of the National Catholic Welfare Conference, to a volume just published here under the title, "The Great Game of Futures." The author is Ernest David MacDougal, economic research specialist.

Dr. Schmiedeler cites the article on "Gambling" in the "Catholic Encyclopedia" as supporting Mr. MacDougal's contention that "futures" trading is unethical. "That the practice is uneconomic should be obvious from the fact that futures trading simply does not return a quid pro quo," he says. "In this connection it may be well to note the point that the author repeatedly makes, namely, that the futures market is not a market for the future delivery of commodities, as is so generally believed. The truth is that practically no commodities are handled."

Price disparity, which results directly from the futures trading "racket," can be counted among the chief causes of the American farmer's distress today, Dr. Schmiedeler says.

SCOUT CHAPLAINS HONOR BISHOP FRANCIS C. KELLEY

OKLAHOMA CITY The Eighth Annual Conference of Diocesan Scout Chaplains will be held here October 28 and 29. It will take the form of a tribute to the Most Rev. Francis C. Kelley, Bishop of Oklahoma City and Tulsa who will celebrate the Pontifical Mass in the Cathedral of Our Lady of Perpetual Help on October 29.

The Most Rev. John A. Duffy, Bishop of Buffalo and Chairman of the Youth Department, National Catholic Welfare Conference, will preach the sermon at the Mass. The Most Rev. Robert E. Lucey, Archbishop of San Antonio, and the Most Rev. Bernard J. Sheil, Auxiliary Bishop of Chicago, will speak at a conference banquet, as well as Dr. James E. West, Chief Executive of the Boy Scouts of America.

McGraw Scrap Book Exhibited At College

ST. BONAVENTURE, N. Y. The personal scrap book of the late John J. McGraw famous figure in baseball, which was presented to St. Bonaventure College by his widow, Mrs. Blanche McGraw, has been placed on exhibition in Friedman Memorial Library.

Contained in the book are newspaper clippings collected by Mr. McGraw, his personal score cards for the 1921 World Series games and pictures of baseball "greats" of his era. Mr. McGraw was graduated from St. Bonaventure College in 1884, a classmate of the late H. Ghey Jennings, also a famous baseball player and manager.

Cottage For Boys Built By Bequest

NEW YORK The gift of \$100,000 by the Hayden Foundation for the erection of three residential cottages for boys at Lincoln Hall, Lencoxdale, Westchester County, was announced yesterday by the Most Rev. Francis J. Spellman, Archbishop of New York. Opened two years ago for the rehabilitation of dependent boys, Lincoln Hall has continued the work of the 75-year-old Catholic Protectorate in the Bronx, sold in 1938 for a housing development. Brothers of the Christian Schools as well as a lay staff, including psychiatrists, physicians, social workers and public school teachers, staff the institution.

NUN BEGINS DENTAL STUDIES



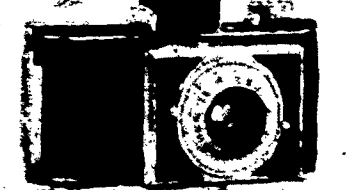
