### Each Must Have 'Peace In His Heart' Avers Archbishop

**QUEBEC (N.S.)**—When each one has peace in his heart, peace founded on love of Christ, there will also be peace in the parish, the region and society, the Most Rev. Alexandre Vachon, Archbishop of Ottawa, said in his sermon concluding a Eucharistic Tribunal at Aylmer on the occasion of the unveiling and dedication of a monument to Christ the King. "There can be no peace with evil and sin," the Archbishop said. "If there is no longer peace in the world of our times, it is because the world is too far from Christ. Let us all return to Him. May His kingdom come and remain among us through His grace. Let us love God and not offend Him. May this divine love be our life, the motor of all our actions."
