

### First "Gold Mass" in Capital

### Emphasizes Advantages of Enlisting

Staff Sergt. Jesse O. Smith, in charge of Army Recruiting for the Rochester Area, pointed out today the advantages of enlisting in the Regular Army against waiting for the call for induction.

"By enlisting for the Regular Army assigned for a three-year period the recruit may have his choice of virtually any branch of service," Sergeant Smith said. "If drafted they will be assigned according to the needs of the Army and not in accordance with the man's personal desires."

"A direct-mail campaign has been started," the Sergeant announced, "to bring these facts to every young man who is slated to report for his pre-induction physical examination within a short time. Local Selective Service Boards will furnish names of all 1-A registrants to Recruiting Officers who are handling all details of the campaign in their respective areas."

"At the present time, there is only six months difference between the service of a selectee and the Regular Army enlistment of three years," Sergeant Smith stated, "and that is outweighed by the many advantages found in the Regular Army. The Air Corps, with its many fine training schools, offers exceptional opportunities to the young man with an eye on the future. The Aviation industry is, without doubt, the fastest-growing industry in the country today, and Army-trained men are in demand. The Air Corps conducts schools in Aircraft welding, machining, mechanics, electrical carburetor experts, propeller specialists, parachute rigging, weather experts, weather observers, photography, and in radio, and if a man wants

travel and adventure, he can enlist for foreign service in Hawaii, Panama, or the Philippines. By enlisting in the Regular Army immediately, the recruit is offered the choice of Cavalry, Field Artillery, Coast Artillery, Engineers, Signal Corps, Medical Corps, Ordnance, Quartermasters, Chemical Warfare or the Infantry."

"If a man has received his notice to report for his pre-induction physical examination, he cannot enlist in the Regular Army until after his induction," the Sergeant explained. The recruiting office located in the Federal Building, Rochester, will be the enrollment point for applicants from that vicinity.

### Open Labor School

Milwaukee-Marquette University opened a Labor School on Oct. 27. It is announced by the Very Rev. Raphael C. McCarthy, S.J., President of the university. The school will offer free courses to union members twice a week. The Rev. Thomas F. Divine, S.J., Professor of Economics at Marquette has been named Director.

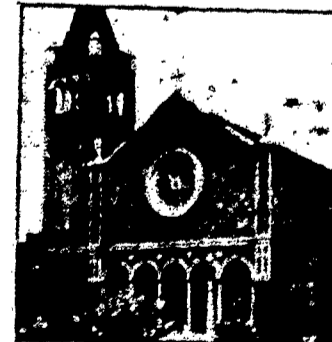
