Friars Use Plane To Locate Ancient Lakes

ST. BONAVENTURE An airplane was utilized recently by the Franciscan friars of St. Bonaventure College to locate two glacial lakes, said to be at least 40,000 years old in the deep woods of the Cattaraugus County hills. The two lakes remnants of the era of the great Wisconsin Glacier had been sought by the priests as likely places where unusual moss and plant specimens could be found.

The project, which has been conducted under the direction of the Rev. Hubert Vecchierello, O.F.M., head of the department, had reached a temporary stalemate. Having only vague knowledge of the locations where it was hoped would produce several additional specimens Father Hubert enlisted the aid of the Rev. Celes Wheeler, O.F.M., co-ordinator for the Civilian airplane pilots training course being conducted at the college.

Father Celes took off from the airport in one of the training ships in the general direction of Little Valley, the suspected location of the lakes. He was accompanied by the Rev. Maurice Scherer, O.F.M., who has been assisting in the moss and plant hunt. The two priests located their objectives in the Township of Naples and marked their location by various signs to guide the party to reach them later by foot.

The expedition returned later on foot to the lakes, learning that they were located in a place known as Water in a Swamp. Father Maurice, the Rev. Philomenus Boehner, O.F.M., and the Rev. Roman Pfeiffer, O.F.M. comprised the party with Father Hubert and the lakes were found to be a source of specimens of unestimable value in their survey of Cattaraugus County vegetation. Father Hubert explained that the two lakes which are now no more than pools of clear water of immeasurable depth, surrounded by swampy bogs, were left when the glacier receded 40,000 years ago.

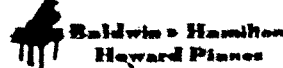
