### Open Martin De Porres House

Invitations have been issued by the Clergy Veteran Unit of the Catholic Students Mission Crusade to a silver tea from 3 to 6 P. M. marking the formal opening of the Martin de Porres House on Clarissa Street.

Prominent Rochester social workers, members of the clergy and parents and friends of the members are expected to be present for the dedication by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph S. Cameron. After the formal opening the unit has planned a program of social action to be conducted in the house. Recreational facilities will be afforded the colored youth and a program of education and entertainment has been worked out for the adults. To meet the rising costs of the house project, the unit is conducting a paper drive enlisting the aid of the grammar school pupils. The papers will be brought to the schools where members of the unit will supervise collection on the first three Saturdays in December. Bulletins have been distributed to the school children explaining the drive to them and their parents.

### Third Order of St. Francis

The Third Order of St. Francis will hold its November meeting at 3:30 Sunday afternoon Nov. 23 at St. Patrick's Church. Rev. Bartholomew J. O'Brien, newly appointed spiritual adviser of the organization will conduct the meeting and the ceremony of profession for those who have completed their year's novitiate.

In these days of wide interest in the propagation of the faith, it is interesting to note that the first to conceive the idea of a sacred congregation of propaganda was a Third Order Franciscan, Blessed Raymond Lulle. In 1267 he presented the idea to Pope Honorarius IV but the plan did not materialize until three centuries later. Saint Camellites did much for the mission idea in the sixteenth century, but not until the fiery preaching of the great Capuchin Friar de Nari, was Pope Gregory XV stirred to write the epochal encyclical written creating the Congregation of Propaganda in 1622. The Capuchin Friar, Sinofio, was the first prefect and the first martyr. was another Capuchin, St. Fidelis de Sigmaringen. Since then many a saint and martyr has come from the ranks of St. Francis.

### Kindergarten School Dedicated By Bishop

HODGE, La. A school that has only a kindergarten and a music department was dedicated by the Most Rev. Daniel F. Desmond, Bishop of Alexandria, on the grounds of St. Henry's Church. Playground equipment has been installed. The parish was established six years ago. There is a Catholic population of 300 in this town of 2,000 inhabitants.
