The Rochester Catholic Labor College held its third class and discussion on Friday evening at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, 402 South Avenue.

Dr. Aaron J. Abell, PhD, head of the History Department of Nazareth College continued his series of lectures on American Labor History. He described the difficulties experienced by trade unions in their fight to have their natural rights of free association and collective bargaining recognized. He declared that the courts recognized the validity of "yellow-dog" contracts until 1912. Such contracts are now invalid under the National Labor Relations Act. Dr. Abell's talk provoked a long and lively discussion on the evils of the "yellow dog" contracts and the exploitation they made possible.


