

Pope's Peace Plan Studied By Verein

Keen interest was manifested in the resolution on 'Peace' adopted by the National Convention of the Catholic Central Verein of America when last Friday evening the Rochester Branches of the Central Verein and the National Catholic Women's Union discussed contents of the resolution.

The resolution was read and analyzed. A full discussion from the floor followed. Many of those who were present in New York at the time the resolution was adopted told of the manner in which it had been framed. It was pointed out that at all times there was kept in mind the five-point program for peace put forward by Pope Pius XII in his Christmas Message of 1959.

Stress was laid on that portion of the resolution which points out that Our Holy Father in his various utterances in regard to peace emphasizes the importance of prayer and the fact that there can be no real peace unless it is based on justice and charity. Emphasis was also laid on that portion of the resolution which says: 'Unless Divine Providence relieves mankind of the scourge of war peace unfortunately seems very remote at present.'

It was shown that the resolution professed the belief of the national organization in a strong defense to protect our country and its possessions against attack.
