ANNOUNCE PUBLICATION OF 'REVIEW FOR RELIGIOUS'

ST. MARY'S, Kans. Review for Religious is the title of a new bi-monthly magazine which will be published beginning January 15, 1942, under the editorship of three faculty members of the Jesuit School of Theology at St. Mary's College here, it is announced.

The periodical will aim to provide religious men and women of the United States, particularly those who are not priests, with an ecclesiastical review which is adapted to their specific needs; it is stated.
