A Carmel in the Philippines
 In a recent communication from the Carmelite Monastery, Jaro Iloilo, Philippine Islands, the holy Sisters make a plea. It is not to help the victims of war, nor to stay the terrors of hunger, but it is to ask that American Catholics help the missionary work in the Philippines forge ahead. As the Sister Priorress says: "So many convents and monasteries are destroyed in other lands, what a grace to help build one for the need of souls."
 "We have been given land to build a monastery," she continues, "but we are very poor materially. In spite of our ardent desires and the encouragement of the Clergy, the Bishop and Apostolic Delegate, we cannot start our building for lack of funds. To begin, any help, large and small, will be gratefully received and the benefactors may rest assured of the prayers and sacrifices offered up by the Sisters of the New Carmel. Who would like to become a founder? Five hundred dollars would make you a founder and \$100 would make you a member, but any amount will list you as a benefactor of the Carmel. We shall write the names of all Founders, Members and Benefactors in a book called, 'The Golden Book of Our Lady of Mount Carmel' and place the book before Our Lady's statue."

Mail From Korea
 This week's mail brought a very appealing letter from Bishop Boniface Sauer, of Tokugen, Korea. We are printing it below in the hope that some of our good friends may be so moved as to lend a helping hand to the good Bishop who is struggling so hard to keep his priests in the field.
 After a long time of silence I am writing you again a few lines to refresh myself and my mission to your kind remembrance. How do you do? I hope you are enjoying good health. Every day I remember your work in my prayers that God may bless it abundantly.

Thanks be to God, now we can continue our work in peace. Unfortunately some weeks ago one of my young Korean priests fell ill. He had to come hither to talk over with me some important matters of his parish. Just when he intended to leave he broke a blood vessel and had to be brought to the hospital for treatment. Now his parish will be without a priest for several months. And what is the cause of this sickness? As the means I give him for his support and for the expenses of the parish are very restricted, his food was, I think, too poor. And I must fear, that he will be the first of some others to follow, as the monthly allowance I can give to my missionaries is too small. But I cannot give more as the means are very limited.
 In closing I thank you once more, dear Father, for all that you have done for my mission. We pray for you. Keep on praying for us and whenever you could help us also in the future, please send it to the Benedictine Mission Home, Schuyler, Nebraska.

 "We think it necessary," *Osservatore* said, "to put all on their guard against this unfounded information, which are all the more to be reproached when, coming as they do in the present moment, their consequences can be all the more grave."

SISTERS OF DESTITUTE APPEAL FOR THE DESTITUTE

The Holy See has sent to our office the letter of Monsignor Vallarumpeth in behalf of the young congregation of the Sisters of the Destitute founded in 1927, to nurse the poor and outcast of India.
 The works of Christ-like charity of these Sisters are in sharp contrast to the pagan neglect of poor, sick and unfortunate people. As a result, conversions to the Church are many.
 Monsignor Vallarumpeth writes: "The Holy Father has sent us some financial assistance and His blessing upon the work and the Sisters. His interest means so much, when one considers the many calls of charity made upon His limited resources."
 "In the name of the Sisters of the Destitute, I appeal to generous souls in America. I place this worthy cause in the care of St. Joseph, our Holy Patron. The Sisters are determined to carry on their work throughout India, administering the charities of Christ."
 "To support a Sister-Nurse requires \$5.00 a week. To construct a center from which these Angels of Mercy will go forth on their mission of love, relief and salvation, \$500 is necessary."
 If you will think of the good these Sisters can accomplish, you will help them. Consider the gratitude and the prayers of the Sisters for you, if you do help them.
 We pray that some good person may give a convent for these Sisters of the Destitute, and that many will support a Sister for a week.
