Stars In Red Cross Radio Appeal

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Paul Mum and Raymond Maase, will head an all-star cast of stage screen and radio personalities dedicating their services to the American Red Cross in a one-hour coast-to-coast broadcast Sunday, Nov. 16 beginning at 1:30 P. M. EST. The broadcast will be a dramatic tone poem "Narrative in Red and White" which traces the history of humanitarianism from biblical days to the present. It will be carried over the NBC Red Network.

CBS and MBS. The unusual presentation will carry to the nation the Red Cross Roll Call appeal which was launched on Nov. 11. The Red Cross this year is appealing for a membership comparable to that of the first World War when more than 18,000,000 adult Americans were enrolled. Chairman Norman H. Davis declared increased support was needed to widen Red Cross services to the armed forces and for Civilian Defense.
