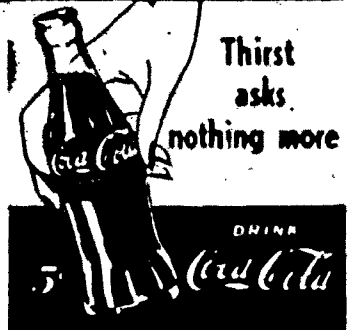

**PROTESTANT LEADER URGES RELIGION IN SCHOOLS**  
WINDSOR, N. B. Rev. E. R. McLean, Boys' Work Secretary for Ontario, speaking at the twenty-second annual convention of the Maritime Religious Education Council, told his fellow Protestant ministers and laity that the Canada of 35 years hence will depend on the type of education given to the youths of today. Every forward step in public school education, he said, must be watched by a forward step in religious education. Steps were taken to cooperate with other denominations towards the introduction of religious education into the public schools.
