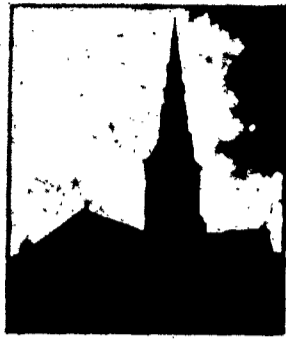

#### Centenary of Eminent Africa Missioner Who Never Went To Africa

VICHY The centenary of a Jew who is regarded as one of the greatest Catholic evangelizers of Africa but who never set foot on African soil has just been observed in France.

He was Father Francis Mary Paul Liebermann, a converted Jew, founder of the Society of the Holy Heart of Mary, which in 1848 was merged with the congregation of the Holy Ghost.

Although he never went to Africa, Father Liebermann is the founding of the Society of the Holy Heart of Mary for the conversion of Africa became one of the greatest African missionaries.

The Congregation of the Holy Ghost today is in charge of 30 ecclesiastical jurisdictions, an evangelical field of 30,000,000 souls and has nearly 3,000,000 under the care of its 4,000 members.
