At the request of Sister M. Evangelia Principal and the Parent Teacher Association of the Nazareth Model School Pittsford the Tuberculosis and Health Association of Rochester and Monroe County gave the mothers and children an opportunity to have the tuberculin skin test Nov. 10.

Assisting in the project were Dr. Curt Falkenheim and Mrs. Rosalie Lortz Association Nurse. Twenty-five children and seven mothers took advantage of the offer. Seven Nursery Schools in Rochester have requested this service from the Association in a cooperative effort to discover early tuberculosis.

Cites Maryknoll Co-Founder

NEW YORK — Renowned as the co-founder of America's first missionary society Bishop James Anthony Walsh of Maryknoll is the subject of Daniel Sargent's latest book "All the Day Long."

Bishop Walsh was a Cambridge-born priest with a consciousness of the world church and her needs which seemed to have grown with him from his boyhood days when he went diligently on his neighborhood rounds collecting pennies for the Holy Childhood. During seminary days in a Superior province he personified his interest by sharing with him memories of Blessed Theophane Venard Toussaint martyr and others who were in the front lines of the Church's mission forces.

After ordination Father Walsh was appointed Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in the Boston Archdiocese in 1907. The Field Atlas, a mission magazine was born and destined to prepare the way for a national seminary for the training of foreign missionaries.

At the International Eucharistic Congress in Montreal, Father Walsh met Father Price, a missionary from North Carolina and discovered that they saw the same need and believed in the same solution. Their plan was placed before the Hierarchy of the United States, which appointed them to found the seminary of their dreams.

N. Y. had the thrill of hardships which was kept wholesome by Father Walsh's charming humor. Maryknoll then moved to its permanent site near Ossining, N. Y.

Today the Maryknoll family numbers 265 priests, 60 Brothers, 252 students and 600 sisters laboring for souls in China, Japan, Korea, Manchukuo, the Philippine and Hawaiian Islands, and along the Pacific Coast in our own country.

Dublin Is Scene Of French Exams

DUBLIN — For the first time in history, French university examinations have been held in Dublin. Entrants were 5 young De La Salle Brothers, natives of Brittany, who were studying in Guernsey at the outbreak of the war.

The question of sitting for the examinations normally held in Paris, presented a problem which was solved when the French Minister in Dublin, Xavier de Laborde, obtained permission from his Government and the French University authorities to hold the necessary tests in Dublin. The papers and oral tests were then prepared by a special Board of Examiners, set up for the purpose in Dublin, French being the medium used throughout.
