Ladies of Charity Speaker Places 'Harlem' Blame

NEW YORK—Speaking on the subject, "God in Charity," the Rt. Rev. William A. Scully, S. T. L., Director of Education in the Archdiocese of New York, told over four hundred members of the Ladies of Charity of New York City at the First Communion Breakfast at the Waldorf Astoria on Saturday morning, Nov. 15, that the slighting of religion especially on the part of educators was primarily responsible for "the problem in Harlem." Monsignor Scully said "There can be no democracy without God, no charity without God, neither can there be true education without God. God in Charity seemed a strange subject to assign to me because I believe it would be difficult to talk about charity without God. I realize that the world has grown cold toward God and religion. We hear a great deal about democracy and about educating for democracy. The founders of our country and the signers of the Declaration of Independence were religious men. You, as Ladies of Charity, have dedicated yourselves, first, to God, and then, to your neighbor. Lady of Charity—what a sweet title! It reminds me of our Blessed Lady of Charity, and today I commend you and your work to her."

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275 Affiliated
Preceding the Breakfast, the Ladies of Charity attended the 20th memorial Mass of the Society at St. Patrick's Cathedral. Celebrant of the Mass was the Most Rev. Stephen J. Donahue, D.D., Auxiliary Bishop of New York, who also officiated at the affiliation of 275 new members. In this ceremony after the Mass, Bishop Donahue was assisted by the Rev. Vincent J. Brosnan, Moderator of the New York Unit of the Society.

Other speakers at the Breakfast were Mrs. Gertrude M. Hourigan, President of the Ladies of Charity of Baltimore and Washington, and Miss Mary E. FitzGerald, Executive Secretary of Ladies of Charity and Catholic Charities of Elmira.
