Christ 'Unwelcome' This Christmas

ST. LOUIS, Mo.—Stressing that this Christmas "Christ" will find Himself more unwelcome than He has been at any time since that first night in Bethlehem.—The Queen's Work, national Sodality monthly published here, in its December issue, will say, in part:

"The armies of the world won't pause in their blasting of civilization to remember it is Christmas Day. If there is Christmas in Red Russia, it will be in despite of the rulers who hate all things that savor of the Redeemer. Christmas will be celebrated in sad Germany, only by those who have the courage to resist the brutal pagan deities returned from Valhalla to make war a ritual and hatred a creed."

"The spirit of the conquered countries will be that of Calvary rather than of Christmas. Christendom, once a dream and later under the Popes almost a reality, has been shattered into the horrible war of the hemispheres. And the Prince of Peace, who was born in a year when no civilized men were at war, will be welcomed by the plane, the tank, the cries of the dying the wails of the conquered."

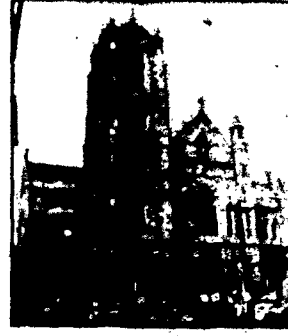
