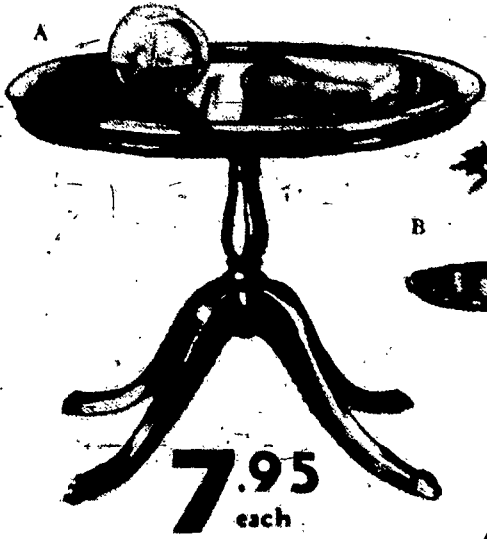

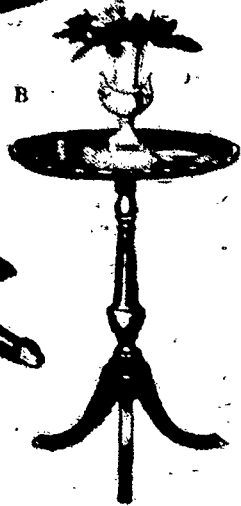

Adventure 1847

A trip through that part of
Canada above Lake Superior and
stretching towards the northwest
would have merited the title
"Adventure" just about a hun-
dred years ago. Unlike today,
when such a journey would be a
welcome vacation, the safari then
over the snow blanketed miles,
through interminable forests,
across immense lakes meant a
constant fight for existence. The
elements were not merciful and
hostile Indians, if encountered,
would not hesitate to kill. The
possibility of these fears materi-
alizing however, was not the
greatest heartache of a mission-
ary priest. It was the knowledge
that even under the best condi-
tions the seed of the Catholic
faith could only be sprinkled
temporarily among the Red Skins
of this district because there
were no priests to harvest the
fruit that would ripen. An ac-
count sent to The Society for the
Propagation of the Faith by Fa-
ther Chones in 1847 of just such
a trip cannot fail to interest our
readers.

"The roads are of ice and snow,
we wear nothing on the feet but
doeskin, and instead of stockings
woolen cloth wrapped entirely
around the leg. Our vehicle con-
sists of a plank from six to seven
feet long by twelve to fifteen
inches wide, curved at the back
in rather an elegant shape. The
missioner places his chugel needs
upon this sledge, and his bed
which consists of a linen sheet
with a buffalo hide, and his pro-
visions with those of his travel-
ing mate. Two or three dogs are
fastened to it, and when all is
ready for starting the wayfarer
proceeds in advance and marks
out in the snow the route for his
sledge. Thus was the beginning
of an adventure for souls in the
northwest which, starting almost
a century ago continues to the
present time.

A Real 'Thank You'

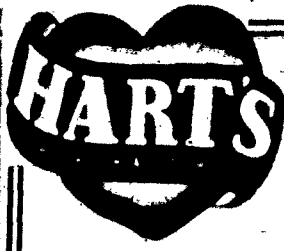
Some mission friends may have
been surprised when the Society
for the Propagation of the Faith
announced its intention to pur-

ary in Kenya Colony East Af-
rica. No doubt they wondered
about the practicability of such a
convenience for carrying the
Cross of Catholicism further
across the boundaries of pagan-
ism. But despite skepticism gen-
erously was the response to this
plan in behalf of Father Hermus
who has written to this Office
the warmest words of gratitude.

"When I wrote to you," states
Father Hermus, "I thought it
would take some 3 or 4 years of
appealing before funds for a
new motorcycle would be ob-
tained and hoped, at the same
time that my present motor with
constant repairing would hold
out as long as that. Now I am
almost stunned to find the re-
quired funds simply rushing in
with more besides. Needless to
say generous American Catho-
lics have made this missioner
overly happy with the thought
that for years to come, he'll be
able to do his work efficiently,
thanks to their prompt answer
to his plea.

English Generosity

Despite the war the English
branch of The Society for the
Propagation of the Faith collect-
ed 500 pounds more during the
12-30-1940 period than the twelve
months preceding. "Knowing the
difficulties, as we do," writes
Msgr. G. Telford, England's Na-
tional Director, "this is a remark-
able result for a war year and
shows that our missionary spirit
has strength and vigor. Never-
theless we have a stern task
ahead if that spirit, the full flow-
er of the Catholic Faith, is to sur-
vive the strain of war. It can
only do so by constant propa-
ganda, the antidote to the war
obsession."

"One of the saddening things
about the present day," contin-
ues Monsignor Telford, "is the
number of missionaries who can-
not get to their posts. Not one
is deterred by the dangers of sea-
travel; they would all face them
gladly and when the war is over
there will be splendid tales of
those who did so. But the wait-
ing list, owing to the transport
difficulties, is intolerably long
and that means danger in the
missions through lack of per-
sonnel."

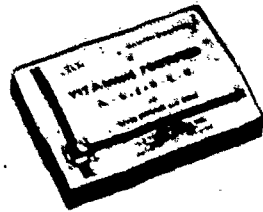
