tional Jesuit review. Father Talbot is one of the foremost Catholic editors of the country. The Rev. Benedict Ehrmann, Ph.D., Professor of Gregorian Chant at St. Bernard's Seminary will speak on "The Indwelling of Christ."

Round Tables at 11 A. M. will succeed the above talks and at 11:30 A. M. at a General Assembly. Rev. Gerald Ellard, S.J., author of "Men at Work at Worship" will close the morning session with a talk on "Putting the Liturgy into the News Columns." Then two luncheons and contest periods will fill in the time until the afternoon session begins.

The Rev. Leo G. Mooney will be the presiding officer of the 100th General Assembly. His Excellency the Most Rev. James Edward Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester will speak on "The Personality of Christ Seen Through the Liturgy." The Rev. Gerald Ellard, S.J. will follow Bishop Kearney in a talk on "The Liturgy in Editorials and Feature Columns."

The Discussion scheduled after these will be led by Miss Patricia Barry who is a Junior at Nazareth College. Miss Barry was a representative at the recent Liturgical Conference at St. Louis.

Exhibits will be shown at 3:00 and at 4:00 there will be more talks in a General Assembly.

Sister Rose Marie of Nazareth College will speak on "The Liturgy in Fiction." Miss Blanche Thompson, LL.B., author of "Silver Pennies" will talk on "The Liturgy for Children." The Liturgy and Art will be discussed by Miss Ade Betts, an artist for the "Catholic Worker" magazine. She will be followed by Rev. Paul Hanley Farley, Ph.D., of the Catholic University of America and author of "Fire on the Earth" who will speak on "The Liturgy and Catholic Action."

At 7:30 is scheduled a Buffet Supper to be followed by dancing and skits. Compline will be sung by the Schola Cantorum of Nazareth Normal School directed by Sister Florian. Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, V.G., Editor-in-Chief of the CATHOLIC COURIER will close the Conference with Benediction.
