

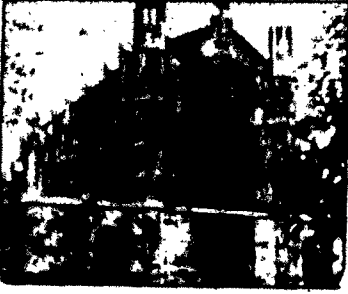

Labor College Hears Of Injunction Laws

Rochester Labor College at the fifth in its series of eight lectures and discussion periods Friday evening at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, 402 South Ave., heard the Rev. George C. Vogt, diocesan director, Confederation of Christian Doctrine and director of the Labor College, repeat his invitation to everyone concerned with the social question to attend the Labor College sessions.

The origin, development and decline of the use of the injunction was discussed by Dr. Aaron I. Abell of Nazareth College continuing his lectures on American Labor History. He defined an injunction as "a court order issued by the civil courts for the purpose of protecting property or property rights."

The injunction, Dr. Abell said, was first used in this country in 1834. It was secured by the Pullman Company against Eugene V. Debs. It became thereafter the favorite weapon of capital in any industrial dispute. Use of the injunction has since been considerably restricted, however, by the Norris-LaGuardia Act of 1932.

McMahon To Preside
 Paul L. Ryan of St. Mary's Parish acted as chairman for the interesting half-hour discussion following Dr. Abell's talk. Ross McMahon of Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral Parish has been named chairman for this week's discussion period.

Father Vogt continued his discussions on Human Rights. He declared that the moral law which St. Paul says is "inscribed on the fleshy tablets of the heart," is the only true basis for human rights. Father Vogt is using Dom Virgil Michel's series of pamphlets on "The Social Question" as a text. He said that this series is a clear and concise statement of Catholic Doctrine as it applies to the social question.

Next session of the Labor College will be held Friday evening, Nov. 28 from 8 to 10 o'clock at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, 402 South Ave.

CARD. HINSLEY BAPTIZES CHILD OF POLISH OFFICER

LONDON.—When His Eminence Arthur Cardinal Hinsley visited a Royal Air Force establishment near here he baptized the child of a Polish air force officer, Flight Lieut. Gutowski.

After offering Mass and preaching to about 200 British and Polish air force men and women, the Cardinal lunched with the Catholic officers. His Eminence paid a tribute to the fortitude of the Polish people in the "most cruel martyrdom" of their country.

Nativity Drama Featured In Edwards Window

Giving over of an entire Main Street display window to a re-creation of the Nativity of the First Christmas is gaining wide commendation for the Edwards Store.

With the use of life-sized figures the department store is presenting, at regular intervals the drama of the Nativity of the Christ-Child in the Bethlehem manger to crowds about the window, each day.

Garbed in their colorful raiment of the East, the Three Wise Men are shown to the right of the window display. Electrically operated these figures seem to come to life.

To the left is the manger where at the appointed time in the drama appear the Blessed Mother bending over the Child in the Crib and St. Joseph.

The shepherds and their sheep are near the crib with the shepherds in adoration. To them is announced by the angels the joyful tidings. The angels, artistically presented in the sky above the scene appear brilliantly illuminated when the curtain parts.

During the enactment of the drama, the voice of a commentator is heard recounting the story of Christ's birth. Interspersed in his commentary are beautiful Christmas hymns sung by capable choirs.

Reverent crowds watch the scene enacted repeatedly during the day. Those who have viewed the window display have expressed their satisfaction in witnessing a presentation of the real meaning of Christmas amid commercial surroundings.

'Democratic Employment' Urged In 3-Day Observance

Catholics of the Rochester Diocese are called to join in the statewide observance of National Defense Through Democratic Practice and to reaffirm at this time "their support of this vital phase of our defense effort."

Governor Lehman has appointed Dec. 5, 6 and 7 for the observance, it is stated in a letter to His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, from Frieda S. Miller, chairman State Committee on Discrimination in Employment.

"It is hoped that all people of the State, employers and employees," the letter states, "aware of the great blessings of democracy which, under Divine Providence they are privileged to enjoy, will search their hearts to weed out tares of prejudice and discrimination and to make real and meaningful in this practical field the practice of democracy."

Three Sons Offer Mass At Final Rites For Lawrence Kaczmarek

Funeral services for the late Lawrence Kaczmarek, father of three Franciscan Fathers O.M.C. and three Felician Sisters were conducted in St. Stanislaus Church, Shamokin, Pa., Thursday, Nov. 20. All members of the family as well as innumerable friends were present to pay their last tribute to this beloved father, and esteemed friend.

Fifty-two priests, both religious and secular, attended to sing the office of the dead and participate in the funeral. Celebrant of the solemn Requiem High Mass was Rev. Giles Kaczmarek, O.M.C., eldest of the three sons-priests, and who is Penitentiarius Apostolicus at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, temporarily performing duties as pastor in Sharon, Pa. Rev. Jerome Holubowicz, O.M.C., pastor of St. Hyacinth Church, Auburn, N. Y., was Deacon, while the Rev. Fabian Zator, pastor at Riverside, N. J., was subdeacon. His brother the Rev. Angelus Zator, pastor of Bridgeport, Conn., was master of ceremonies. Simultaneously, Masses were offered at the side altars by the other two sons, the Rev. Simon Kaczmarek, O.M.C., pastor of St. Theresa's Church, Rochester, and the Rev. Anacleto Kaczmarek, O.M.C., novice Master at Ellcott City, Md.

Absolution was pronounced by the Very Rev. Provincial Lawrence Cyman, O.M.C., of Chicopee, Mass., who also spoke a few words eulogizing the good deeds of the deceased. His words brought great consolation to the members of the family in the hour of their grief.

The late Lawrence Kaczmarek is distinguished in this manner that he has never denied a son nor daughter to enter the Convent. As a result he had six of his children sacrifice their lives in the vineyard of the Lord. One of the daughters, Sister M. Amelia passed away in December, 1931 after serving her Community for some twenty-eight years. Sisters Viatora and Consuela are presently located in St. Anthony's Convent, Jersey City, N. J.

Of the sons he was rightfully proud owing to the fact that as soon as the Franciscan College in Athol Springs was established, Father Giles was appointed Superior. Father Anacleto took care of the students throughout his priestly career, first in Athol Springs, N. Y., then in Granby, Mass., and presently as Novice Master in Ellcott City, Md. Father Simon is now pastor of St. Theresa's Church in Rochester, being appointed to this position by his Superior in 1935.

The Felician Sisters, daughters of the late Lawrence Kaczmarek, have been stationed in various parishes in the Eastern states performing teaching duties in the Polish parochial schools. Helen is a teacher in the Shamokin public schools, while Catherine always took care of the home duties. Two other sons survive, Anthony, a communicant of the Blessed Sacrament Parish in Rochester, and Stanley, residing in Shamokin, Pa.

Lawrence Kaczmarek lived a peaceful life full of sacrifice for his neighbors and "there is no doubt that after his demise the good Lord will tender him with the eternal crown of happiness."
