Funeral services for the late Lawrence Kaczmarek, father of three Franciscan Fathers O.M.C., and three Felician Sisters, were conducted in St. Stanislaus Church, Shamokin, Pa., Thursday, Nov. 20. All members of the family as well as innumerable friends were present to pay their last tribute to this beloved father and esteemed friend.

who also spoke a few words eulogizing the good deeds of the deceased. His words brought great consolation to the members of the family in the hour of their grief.

Fifty-two priests, both religious and secular, attended to sing the office of the dead and participate in the funeral. Celebrant of the solemn Requiem High Mass was Rev. Giles Kaczmarek, O.M.C., eldest of the three sons-priests, and who is Penitentiarius Apostolicus at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, temporarily performing duties as Pastor in Sharon, Pa. Rev.
