NUN ADVISES P. T. A.

GENEVA St. Stephen's Parent Teacher Association at a recent program Nov. 14 in the parish house heard Sister Paulette head of the Psychology Department of Nazareth College in Rochester as guest speaker.

Sister Paulette opened her talk by stating that few parents realize that the first six years are the most important in the shaping of the character of a child. By the time the child is ready for the first grade his habits and personality have been greatly acquired.

Emphasis was placed on the child's need for affection. The child relies on the affection of his parents and teachers to be sure of his personal value. He has no past accomplishments to rely upon for his self-esteem, so naturally he depends upon affection to give him a healthy normal personality.

Affection must be demonstrated to a child, the speaker pointed out, since he has no other way of measuring an adult's esteem of him. To repress all affection for a child is by far more harmful than too much affection. If a child fails to receive affection he feels rejected and hurt.

Both parents and teachers should realize that a child praised will continue to earn more and more.

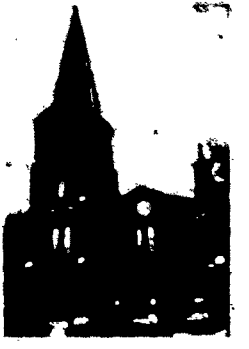
