

Pontifical Mass On Dec. 6 Marks Feast For Sodalists

Annual observance by Rochester Parish Sodality Union of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Patroness of the United States will be marked at a Solemn Pontifical Mass at Sacred Heart Cathedral Saturday Dec. 6.

The Solemn Mass to be celebrated by His Excellency Bishop Keane will begin at 12:15 p. m.

Sermon for the occasion will be preached by the Rev. John A. Murphy, C.S.S.R., Rector of the Diocesan Retreat House of Our Lady of the Lake at Geneva.
