Mission Crusade Plans Good Will Broadcasts To Latin America

CINCINNATI (NO) A new project in the maintenance of good-will between the nations of the Western Hemisphere will be inaugurated December 11 with the opening of a series of weekly radio broadcasts to Latin America by the Catholic Students Mission Crusade with headquarters at the Crusade Castle in this city. Programs of music with short addresses in Spanish will be offered by high schools, colleges and other groups affiliated with the Crusade throughout the United States. The programs will be presented at 5 p. m. Eastern Standard Time and again at 10:30 P. M. every Thursday, on varying radio frequencies and wave-lengths through Station WLWO, short-wave transmitter of the Crosley Radio Corporation.

The opening program, consisting of orchestral and choral music, will be presented by Vincent A. Orlando. Guest of honor for the initial broadcast will be the Most Rev. John T. McNicholas, O.P., Archbishop of Cincinnati and National President of the Mission Crusade, who will deliver an invocation in Latin. Following this, an address of greeting to Latin-American listeners will be delivered in Spanish by Olga Rodriguez, a Puerto Rican student at Mount St. Joseph.

Transcriptions To Be Made

The second program will go on the air Thursday, December 18 at the same hour and will be presented by Our Lady of Cincinnati College Glee Club, with the college musical director, Dr. John J. Fehring in charge.

The project of good-will radio programs to Latin America has been undertaken by the Mission Crusade in consequence of a resolution adopted by the twelfth national convention of the organization last June. Programs will be sponsored by units of the C. S. M. C. throughout the country. Groups outside of Cincinnati will present their programs by transcription.

Station WLWO on which the C. S. M. C. programs will originate, has the top-ranking United States short-wave power of 75,000 watts, which is aimed by directional beam to Latin America. In addition to WLWO, the series of programs will be carried by 23 stations affiliated with Cadena Radio Inter-Americana, the Latin-American network organized by the Crosley Corporation.

The network includes standard-band and short-wave stations in 16 Latin-American cities. The stations are as follows: Mexico: XEB and XEPT in Mexico City; Guatemala, TGW and TGWA in Guatemala City; El Salvador, YSDN in San Salvador; Honduras, HRN in Tegucigalpa; Costa Rica, TIP in San Jose; Panama, HPSB and HPSB in Panama City; Venezuela, XVIR and YVIRX in Maracaibo, and YVSRB and YVSRM in Caracas; Colombia, HJEL in Cali; Ecuador, HC2AJ in Guayaquil; Peru, OAX41 and OXA4J in Lima; Cuba, CMCK and COCO in Havana; Puerto Rico, WIAC.
