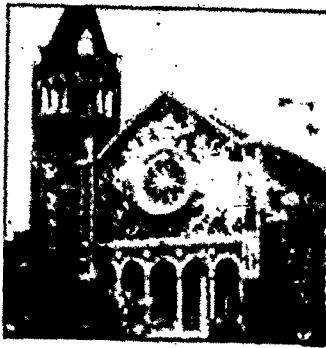
SODALITY DANCE
