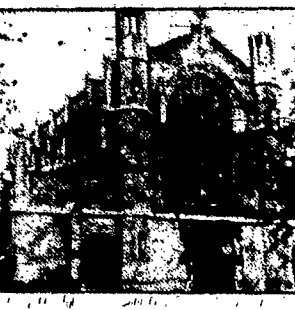

Discusses Industrial Peace At Labor School

Two interesting lectures followed in each case by lively discussion marked the sixth regular session of Rochester Labor College which is held every Friday evening from 8 to 10 P. M. at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, 402 South Ave.

First lecture and discussion period begins promptly at 8 P. M. and ends at 9. The second begins after a five-minute recess and ends at 10 o'clock. First half hour of each class is taken up with the lecture and the last half, with an informal discussion. After 10 o'clock the discussion continues over a cup of coffee.

The first lecture is given by Dr. Aaron L. Abell Ph.D., head of the history department at Nazareth College. Subject of his talk last Friday was "The General Methods of Securing Industrial Peace." He declared that the basis for industrial peace lies in the recognition by law and by the public of labor's right to organize in associations of their own choosing and to bargain collectively. It is only when these rights are recognized that trade agreements can be made and can be effective, he pointed out.

Discussion following centered on the part the State should play in industrial relations. It was generally agreed that social legislation and some state regulation is necessary in order to protect the rights of labor. There was some disagreement concerning the part which government should play in industrial disputes.

Ross McMahon of Sacred Heart Parish led the discussion. George Gallagher of Holy Cross parish has been named chairman for next week's discussion.

The Rev. George C. Vogt, director of the Labor College continued his lecture on Human Rights. He reviewed Monsignor Sheen's new book, "A Declaration of Independence," in which he maintains that Christianity is the only basis for Democracy.

A lively discussion on the question of whether the worker has an obligation to join a union followed. Father Vogt's talk. Consensus was that every worker does have an obligation to join a union. The usual objections against unions were held to be valid only because many workers refuse to join unions.

Next regular session of the Rochester Catholic Labor College will be held Friday evening, Dec 5, from 8 to 10 P. M.
