MARK 30TH ANNIVERSARY

Achievements of the pastor with the loyal cooperation of his congregation during thirty years of the parish's existence were extolled by His Excellency Bishop Kearney, at the Solemn Pontifical Mass marking the 30th anniversary of Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral parish Sunday.

On behalf of the Diocese of the Bishops who have gone before me and those called to their eternal rest, Bishop Kearney extended gratitude to the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns, pastor of the Sacred Heart parish since its beginning for his leadership and for the "magnificent cooperation" received from his people.

The congratulations of the Congregation of St. Paul were brought by the Rev. William P. McDonnell of New York this week continuing a mission in Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral.

APPLE FOR FREEDOM
WILLIAM TELL, SWISS PATRIOT AND SUPER BOWMAN, SENTENCED TO DEATH BY AN AUSTRIAN TYRANT, SAVED HIS LIFE BY SHOOTING AN APPLE OFF THE HEAD OF HIS YOUNG SON. HE EVENTUALLY FREED THE SWISS FROM THEIR OPPRESSORS.

AMERICAN BOMBING A "DUB"
NOV. 12, 1926.
THERE WAS AN ACTUAL BOMBING BY PLANE IN THE UNITED STATES. AS CLIMAX TO A RUN WAR, THREE CLOUDS MADE BOMBS WERE DROPPED IN WILLIAMSON COUNTY, VA. THE BOMBS FAILED TO EXPLODE AND THE OCCUPANTS ESCAPED UNHARMED.

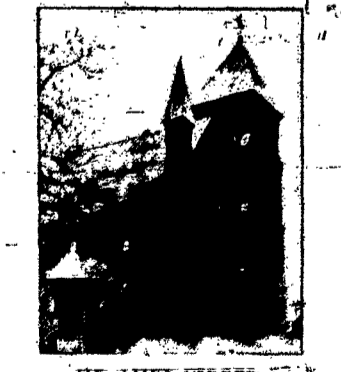
