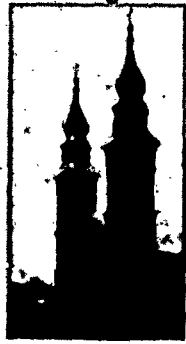

**FORTY HOURS**
