Says Truth About God Heads Real Priorities

BROOKLYN. The truth about God heads the real priorities list for America, the Rev. Dr. Joseph C. Fenton, of the School of Sacred Theology, Catholic University of America, declared in an address at a meeting of the Catholic Lawyers' Guild here. His subject was "Realism About God."

"The truths which Jesus Christ enunciated about God fall into two distinct classes," Dr. Fenton said. "None of them are mysteries, truths which no creature could possibly know if God had not communicated them in His revelation. To this class belong the teachings on the Blessed Trinity; on the Incarnation; on Faith and on the life of grace. Others, although they enter into the fabric of divine revelation, can be known naturally by man. These truths can be shown and demonstrated by processes of clear and rigorous scientific accuracy. In this class we find the teaching on the existence of a living personal God."

"Behind all the conflicts and troubles that afflict the world of our own time we find one vital question: Is there a God to Whom we are responsible? a God to Whom we can appeal? a God Who cares for us? Who loves and loves us?" If there is not, then everything which we know by the name of culture or of morality is only a figment of the imagination. Since there is a personal God He is the central and all important reality in the lives of men and of nations."

Program Demand Reveals Newman Clubs' Interest In Catholic Social Teaching

WASHINGTON. Interest of Newman Clubs in State and other secular universities in the application of Catholic social teaching is indicated in the increasing number of these clubs which use the monthly Catholic Action Program Service issued by the Social Action Department of the National Catholic Welfare Conference.

This service which goes to over 350 Catholic educational institutions of which nearly 50 are Newman Clubs, consists of program suggestions for class club and general use on a different social subject each school month. The monthly program is based on the study articles contained in Catholic Action, official publication of the N. C. W. C. Supplementary current pamphlet material is distributed for use with the program service.

The general theme of the Service for 1941-42 is Bulwarks of Democracy. Among the subjects treated monthly are Religion Education, the Family, Human Freedom and Rights, the Press, Unity of Action, Economic Justice and International Justice.

Argentine City Names Street For Don Bosco

ROSARIO, Argentina. The Municipal Council has paid homage to the memory of St. John Bosco by naming a street in the suburb of Tafres and appropriating the sum of \$200 for the erection of a plaque in Don Bosco's honor at a suitable place to be designated later.

Several streets in Argentine cities—Baha Blanca, Cordoba, Viedma, Comodoro Rivadavia, Alta Gracia, Bernal, Rawson, Trelew have been named for the Saint. A railroad station near the Capital also bears his name.

Eldest Basillian Dies In Canada

TORONTO. The Rev. Richard Thomas Burke, C.S.B., eldest member of the Congregation of St. Basil in Canada, is dead at the age of 82. He was ordained 55 years ago, and fourteen years later entered the Basilian community. He served as professor and pastor in Detroit, Waco, Texas, and various cities of Ontario. Since 1930 he had been at St. Michael's College here.
