Bishop Kearney confirmed a class of 16 including 7 adults at St. Stephen's Church at 3 o'clock. The main altar of the church was beautifully decorated for the occasion with bouquets of white chrysanthemums and red roses and lighted tapers.

The Bishop addressed the class on the subject of the Sacrament of Confirmation, emphasizing its importance and calling it "a Christmas gift from God to the members of the confirmation class.

Confirmation was administered at 4:30 at St. Francis de Sales Church to a class of 25 candidates including 12 adults. Bouquets of red roses and many lighted candles decorated the main altar for the services.

Bishop Kearney also delivered a brief but inspiring address to the confirmation class. Later he acted as celebrant at the celebration of the Blessed Sacrament, assisted by Rev. Theodore Winterbach of Stanley and Rev. John Brady.

Bishop Kearney remained for dinner at St. Francis de Sales rectory last evening and left immediately for Rochester to preside at a special evening service there.
