

Cathedral Pageant Ushers In Christmas Observance**Pontifical Midnight Mass Listed Dec. 24; Pageant Set Sunday**

In preparation for the joyous Feast of the Nativity of the Savior the beautiful and impressive Christmas Pageant will be conducted at Sacred Heart Cathedral Sunday evening Dec. 24 at 8 P.M. Solemn Pontifical Mass will be celebrated at Midnight Christmas Eve in the Cathedral.

The pageant will open with the processional escorting His Excellency the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, to the throne. The Bishop will be accompanied by the Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns and priests of the Cathedral, serving as deacons, subdeacons and master of ceremonies.

The Cathedral Men's Choir under the direction of Rev. H. Kramer will sing, "Joy to the World" to be followed by the singing of the Gospel of the Nativity by the Deas of "Silent Night," "Hark! The Glad Tidings," "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

Sermon for the service will be preached by the Rev. John A. Murphy, C.S.C., Rector of the Newman Center, followed by the lighting of the Advent wreath.

A processional of school children will sing "Blessed Mother" followed by the Canticle and the Te Deum which will be played in the organ loft of the cathedral.

Special music will be performed at the first light will play upon the altar as the faithful come forward to kneel in adoration.

At the Solemn Pontifical Mass to be celebrated by His Excellency Bishop Kearney, at Midnight in the Cathedral Christmas assisting will be the Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns as Assistant Priest, the Rev. Edward M. Lyons and the Rev. Alphonse P. Crimmins as Deacons of Honor, the Rev. Mr. Walter Fleming, deacon, and Mr. John Koch subdeacon, with the Rev. John T. Callahan as Master of Ceremonies.

Special music will be sung by the Cathedral Men's Choir.

On Christmas Day, Bishop Kearney will celebrate his third Mass at 9 o'clock in the Cathedral and will greet the parishioners at the 9, 10 and 11 o'clock Masses.
