### K. of C. Offers Club For Defense Use

Use of their clubhouse and facilities for national defense purposes has been offered to authorities here by Elmira, Council Knights of Columbus.

Following is a letter sent to City Manager Ralph D. Kubes, Chemung County and Chemung County Civilian Defense Council:

"My dear Mr. Kubes: The Elmiran Council Knights of Columbus adopted the following resolution unanimously at a regular meeting Monday, Dec. 15:

"Resolved that the rooms and facilities of Columbus Centre be made available to the Elmiran and Chemung County Civilian Defense Council for any meeting they may desire to hold there and be it further

"Resolved that the accommodations of Columbus Centre be available to military leaders who may be in Elmiran on civilian defense matters, and be it further

"Resolved that Elmiran Council go on record as heartily supporting and offering full cooperation to any action taken by the Elmiran and Chemung County Civilian Defense Council to protect and promote the welfare of this section of the United States."

### Support of Nation Pledged By Social Justice Club

Support of the Government in the emergency is pledged by the Social Justice Club of Rochester, a statement issued by John J. Finnegan, president of the Club, states.

The statement follows: "At a meeting of the Social Justice Club of Rochester on Monday evening, Dec. 15 at St. Joseph's Hall, the membership assembled agreed to give full support to the president of the United States and the Government in this crisis. The War on the Pacific has been forced upon the United States. Japan's attack in the Pacific is a matter of the defense of the nation and no American has any right, whatsoever by word or deed to do anything but help. There can be no discussion and no expression of opinion today, except in one way. Every American, regardless of his views in the past, must be an American and only an American. Every man, woman and child must stand behind the United States government in its defense of the nation. Victory can only be achieved by complete defeat of the Axis Powers. The Club further proposes to use all its energy in helping to win this war by its donations to the Red Cross, USO and other authorized agencies."

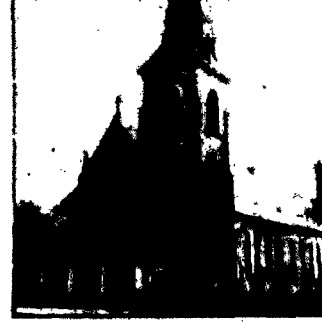
### Mother of 2 Priests, Five Nuns, Dies at 82
