

Cathedral Pageant Ushers In Christmas Observance

Pontifical Midnight Mass Listed Dec. 24; Pageant Set Sunday

In preparation for the joyous feast of the Nativity of the Savior, the beautiful and impressive Christmas Pageant will be conducted at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Sunday evening, Dec. 21, at 8 P.M.

The pageant will open with the procession escorting His Excellency the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, to the throne. The Bishop will be accompanied by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns and priests of the Cathedral serving as deacon, subdeacon and master of ceremonies.

The Cathedral Men's Choir under the direction of Ray Hasenauer will sing "Jesu-Bambino" to be followed by the singing of the Gospel of the Nativity by the Deacon "Silent Night Holy Night" sung by the Cathedral choir follows.

Prayers for the occasion will be preached by the Rev. John A. Murphy, C.S.S.R., Rector of the diocesan retreat house of Our Lady of the Lake at Geneva.

A procession of school children escorting the "Blessed Mother" will enter the Cathedral and the infant will be placed in the manger in the sanctuary. "Adeste Fideles" will be sung as this proceeds to be followed by the Choir singing "Come Come Come to the Manger."

The Cathedral will be darkened and a spot light will play upon the Child as the faithful come forward to kneel in adoration.

At the Solemn Pontifical Mass to be celebrated by His Excellency Bishop Kearney, at Midnight in the Cathedral Christmas, assisting will be the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns as Assistant Priest, the Rev. Edward M. Lyons and the Rev. Alphonsus P. Crimmins as Deacons of Honor, the Rev. Mr. Walter Fleming, deacon, and Mr. John Roch's subdeacon, with the Rev. John T. Callahan as Master of Ceremonies.

Special music will be sung by the Cathedral Men's Choir. On Christmas Day, Bishop Kearney will celebrate his third Mass at 9 o'clock in the Cathedral and will greet the parishioners at the 9, 10 and 11 o'clock Masses.
