On Wednesday, Jan. 7, Ukrainian Catholics throughout the world will celebrate Christmas. The Ukrainian Catholics are of the Eastern Rite and still adhere to the old Julian Calendar which is thirteen days behind the Gregorian Calendar.

In Rochester, Ukrainians will also celebrate Christmas on Wednesday, Jan. 7, by attending High Mass at 10 A. M. at St. Joseph's Ukrainian Catholic Church on Hudson Avenue of which Rev. Basil Turula is pastor.

On Christmas Eve, Tuesday, Jan. 6, High Mass will be celebrated at 12 o'clock midnight.

St. Joseph's Choir, which has just celebrated its 30th anniversary last Thanksgiving, will present a full half hour of Ukrainian Christmas Carols sung in their native tongue on Sunday, Jan. 4, over Radio Station WSAJ.

is stated, will clarify the relation of the Church and Churchmen to the present world crisis. It is asked that all will listen to Father Graham, a renowned, forceful speaker of the Dominican Order.

Plans for the observance are being made under the guidance of the Diocesan Holy Name Union spiritual director, the Rev. F. William Stauder, and assistant director, the Rev. Arthur F. Florack, and in the deaneries under the guidance of these spiritual directors, the Rev. John J. Healy, Auburn deanery; the Rev. Magr. J. J. Lee, V.F., Elmira deanery; the Rev. William J. O'Brien, Geneva deanery, and the Rev. John J. Smith, Corning deanery.

As a fitting climax to the observance the "Candle Light Ceremony" will be held in four Rochester district churches. Plans have been made to accommodate members from all city and outlying parish Holy Name societies in these four churches:

St. Michael's Church, Clinton Avenue North, in the Northeast district.

Holy Rosary Church, Lexington Ave. in the Northwest district.

St. Augustine's Church, Chili Avenue, Southwest district.

Blessed Sacrament Church, Oxford St., Southeast District.

Special services have been arranged to take place simultaneously in each district church at 4 o'clock Sunday afternoon.

During Solemn Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament all lights will be extinguished and each man will hold a lighted candle while standing and join in the singing of the "O Salutaris" and the "Tantum Ergo" and will recite after the priest, the Holy Name Pledge.

Preceding the Special Benediction there will be the recitation of the Litany of the Holy Name of Jesus, appropriate hymns and a sermon. The service will close with the singing of Holy God.

Each man is asked to bring a candle used in the home or candles used at any former Holy Name Rally. Candles will be available at the district churches for those who are not provided with one. It is expected that capacity crowds will attend each district church and that an unusual and impressive ceremony will be witnessed.

President Frank E. Wolfe announces that plans are progressing for the celebration of the 10th anniversary of the organization of the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union during the spring of 1942.

4th Degree Opens Campaign For \$10,000 In U. S. Bonds

A Defense Bond and Stamp Campaign with a goal of \$10,000 in those U. S. Government securities will be launched on Jan. 3 by Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus. It is announced by Cyril J. Stasi, Master of the Fifth District and Campaign chairman.

Members are being called upon to cooperate. The amount of their subscriptions in bonds and stamps will be delivered to them at the conclusion of the campaign on Jan. 15, 1942, the announcement states.

The campaign has been given the hearty endorsement of His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, state chaplain of the K. of C., who is serving as honorary chairman.

"Your country is now engaged in a vicious war of defense," the announcement states, "that was

brought upon us by a dastardly attack upon our Pacific Possessions."

The total amount raised by subscription will be invested in a lump sum in bonds and stamps by Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, and each member will receive bonds and stamps for the amount of his contribution.

Father Decries Sympathy For Sons In U. S. Marines

CLEVELAND — One American family has gone eloquently on record as not wanting neighborly sympathy over the fact that it has two sons in the armed service of the United States.

"I would like to serve notice on my wife's dear friends that it would add greatly to the peace of our home if all of them would stop crying on her shoulder because she has two sons enlisted in the marines," W. T. O'Malley, of Cleveland, wrote in a letter to the Cleveland Press.

"My wife sheds no tears, but is proud that she has two big, healthy, strapping specimens of humanity of sons that were able to pass the severe test that the marines put them through. She feels that it is an honor and only what is expected of each and every American youth who has been given the wonderful benefits that this country affords them."

"We hope God spares them to come back home to us," Mr. O'Malley continued, "but if they are sacrificed on the altar of freedom we can only say God gave us two wonderful sons and we are going to

give them back to God." The letter was signed: "An American Dad That Trusts In American Ideals."
