

Pittsburgh Priest To Conduct Retreat

The Rev. John J. Hugo, professor of religion in St. Mercy College, Pittsburgh, will conduct a three-day retreat sponsored by the Catholic Worker Group, opening at 8 p. m. Friday, Jan. 2, in Columbus Civic Centre Chapel.

Father Hugo, who is the author of many articles in the Catholic Worker, nationally distributed newspaper, recently gave a week-long retreat for members of the group at the C. W. farm in Easton, Pa. He is officially classed as a retreat master for the Diocese of Pittsburgh.

Father Hugo will give one conference Friday night, and five conferences on Saturday and on Sunday, two in the morning, three in the afternoon and one each evening. Retreatants who do not take their meals in the Civic Centre will be served at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, 602 South Ave., which is conducted by the C. W. Group. The Rev. George C. Vogt, director of the Diocesan Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, is chaplain of the group.
