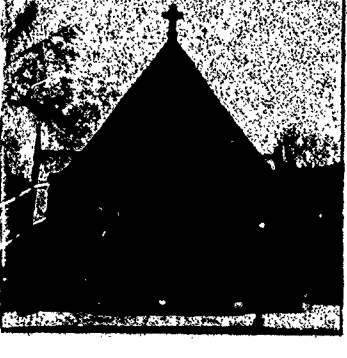

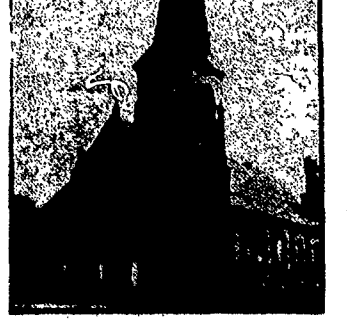

**Card. Hinsley Favors Family Allowances Before Age Pensions**

LONDON (NC) — His Eminence Arthur Cardinal Hinsley favors family allowances before old age pensions, for "the children are vital, the aged have done their day's work."

The Cardinal has sent this message to the Yorkshire Evening News which had invited a statement on family allowances:

"Family allowances are more necessary for national welfare than old age pensions. The children are vital, the aged have done their day's work. Both provisions are a call on the nation; but begin with the most needy."

"Mothers with big families go out to work to eke out the family budget. They suffer from overwork and under-nourishment. The children suffer in consequence. So I consider that family allowances should have come earlier in our program for social improvement."

"For moral reasons more than for economic reasons let us get on with this job of providing the means of rearing good, healthy families; so we shall remove the reproach of great poverty side by side with wealth. From the sound family will spring a strong people."

**Sing First High Mass In Louisiana Parish**

LAKE PROVIDENCE, La. — The High Mass sung immediately after the dedication of St. Margaret's Church in the Fiske-Union community was the first High Mass ever sung in West Carroll (civil) parish, and probably the first Mass offered in this civil parish since the War Between the States.

The Most Rev. Daniel F. Desmond, Bishop of Alexandria, dedicated the chapel and the Rev. John Vandegast, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Lake Providence, was celebrant of the Mass. The Church, which seats approximately 100, was built entirely by the men of the community, supervised by Father Vandegast.

Until St. Margaret's Church, supplied their needs, the nearest churches were between 30 and 40 miles away.
