HOLY FAMILY SUNDAY

In accordance with the Bishop's request and following out a rapidly growing custom of the past few years, every family in the parish is invited to receive Holy Communion as a family group on next Sunday, the feast of the Holy Family. To help make this possible there will be no special children's Mass this Sunday. Although it is also the regular Sunday for the monthly Communion for the members of the Holy Name Society, they too will not be asked to attend the 7 o'clock Mass as they usually do, in order to give them an opportunity to go to Holy Communion with the rest of their families at whatever Mass is more convenient for them.

The January meeting for the members of the Holy Name Society will be held next Monday evening in the school Auditorium at 8
