## St. George's School Wins Paper Drive First Prize

With a high average of 65 pounds of paper per student, St. George's School today was declared first prize winner in the recent paper drive conducted by the elementary schools

of Rochester as their participation in the National Defense program and the local Negro mission project.

Students from the fourth to the eighth grades were invited to participate in the Drive. Prizes were awarded on the basis of the greatest amount of paper collected per student. The 37 students of St. George's School collected 65 pounds of paper apiece, or a total of 2,400 pounds. Officials of the Waste Paper Conservation Committee, commenting on the job said that St. George's School, particularly in view of such a small registration, did an outstanding piece of work, and commended both the Sisters and the pupils for the very efficient way in which the paper was collected, stacked and bundled. As a reward for their efforts, St. George's School will receive a large statue of Blessed Martin de Porres, patron of the new Negro Settlement to which the funds realized from the Drive will be donated.

Outstanding Work by Blessed Sacrament School  
Collecting the largest amount of paper of any school in the Drive, and ranking second in line are the boys and girls from Blessed Sac-

rament School. They collected 19,875 pounds, "a most remarkable amount of paper," according to the Conservation Committee. This is an average of 54 pounds per student. Because of the unusual amount of paper collected, it was decided by the committee to make a special award to the second place winners. Ranking in third place is St. Margaret Mary's School with an average of 54 pounds of paper per student. St. Charles Borromeo follows close in fourth place with 41 pounds per student.

Rev. John S. Randall, Director of the Holy Childhood Association, under whose auspices the drive was conducted, praised the splendid work of the boys and girls very highly, saying that "it shows the true spirit of our boys and girls, working both for their God and their Country."

From the sale of the paper \$1,040 was realized. This money will be used in religious training among the Negroes of Rochester through the medium of the Martin de Porres Settlement House, conducted under the leadership of the Cleary Veteran Unit of the C. S. M. C.
