## DEFENSE BOND SALE

The campaign to sell Defense Stamps is beginning this week in St. Patrick's School. Rev. William J. O'Brien, pastor, who is a member of the County Defense Savings Committee, has called upon each pastor in Elmira and asked full cooperation with the Defense Committee in the selling of stamps.

A drive to aid the Red Cross is also underway in the parochial schools. The splendid work of this organization is now in progress wherever there is hardship or suffering and the school children are being encouraged to save their pennies to help the Red Cross.

The children are also lending their help in a spiritual way in compliance with Bishop Kearney's request for a Crusade of Prayer. Each child adopts spiritually some member of the armed forces and offers daily prayers for him.

Members of St. Patrick's parish who have relatives in the service are asked to submit this information at the rectory. It should include the name of the service man, his address and camp.

## Nuns Work Among Russian Catholics

NEW YORK.—An "encouraging growth of fervor" among Russian Catholics in Shanghai is reported in a communication received by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith here.

"The Holy Father, it is reported, has entrusted to the Sisters of St. Columban the care of the Russian

children in Shanghai and services in the convent chapel are conducted in the Byzantine rite. An American priest has been ordained in the Byzantine rite, and work is progressing on a new College and Hostel for Russian boys, from which it is hoped vocations will come to rebuild the now decimated Catholic clergy of Russia.

In addition to the undertaking in Shanghai, work among Russian inhabitants is being done by the Ursuline Sisters in Harbin, Manchukoo, where they conduct a school for girls and follow the Byzantine rite in the divine services.
