Oldest St. Louis U. Alumnus Dies At 101

ST. LOUIS—Joseph W. Rickert, who was the oldest alumnus of St. Louis University and who once served as Governor of Illinois for three days, has died at the age of 101 years at his home in nearby Waterloo, Ill. Funeral services were held yesterday from St. Peter and Paul's Catholic Church in Waterloo.

Behind him lay a distinguished civic and political career. President of the Commercial State Bank of Waterloo for the last 37 years, he made daily trips to his law office until a month ago. His other activities, besides his law practice, which had been continuous since 1869, included the chairmanship of two farmer mutual insurance companies and the management of two large farms.
