NEW YORK.—At the request of the "Governor" of Taos, New Mexico Indian Pueblo, and his Council, the Rev. James V. Manning, M.M., formerly of Richmond Hill, L. I., was asked to celebrate Mass for the state of the whole world.

"The Indian Governor and the council," writes Father Manning, the Maryknoll chaplain of Holy Cross Hospital at Taos, "came to me one morning that they were quite concerned about world events, and wished to do something about them—not for themselves alone, but for everyone of every race. So, as true Catholics, they asked that I celebrate Mass, as ceremoniously as possible, for the improvement of world conditions."

Accordingly, on the following Saturday morning a Solemn High Mass, followed by a procession of the Blessed Sacrament, was offered for the Indians' intentions.
