In my estimation, one of the worst things that a person could do is to ask the Good Lord to damn his neighbor. As a Catholic, it is needless for me to say that the good name of God is being used with shameful respect by many people daily—people who forget that the Good Lord is their Divine Maker and Judge.

What do you think the Good Lord is going to say to you when you die and have to meet Him face to face for judgment after using His Holy Name without respect? Out of the Ten Commandments which God gave Moses, the Second Commandment was one of the most sacred Commandments to the law of the chosen people. It was so sacred that in the early days of the Church, many people were punished, and some were even stoned to death for breaking that one Commandment.

Please allow me to demonstrate my cause for this little write-up. A certain person works with you in a shop, factory, or store. Something goes wrong with his work, and for no reason at all, the first thing he asks is that God damn the work which has aroused his anger. That is one of the most vile habits that any man or woman could get into. I speak not only of men in particular, but also women as well.

Another case is that which starts at home when the parents take the Good Lord's Name in vain in front of their little children, who in later life follow the example of their parents. The Good Lord has given you a home and a family, and in return, you use His Divine Name without reverence.

Would you want someone to ask God to damn your family? Suppose everyone who wished the Good Lord to damn their fellow-men got his wish. Wouldn't this be a pitiful world to live in? Have you ever stopped to consider that if you received a penny for every time the Lord's name was taken in vain daily, you would probably be one of the richest men on earth. I am not speaking by guesswork, but from experience, and experience is the best teacher.

Take for example a man or woman who has become intoxicated from liquor, forgets himself or herself, and begins to use blasphemy against God. To some extent, these people are to be looked upon with sympathy, for they are in a drunken state and do not know any better. But a man or woman who is in his or her right mind and who wilfully takes God's Name in vain should be ashamed to show his or her face in public.
