HOLY NAME ELECTION HELD

After a short business meeting which included the election of new officers, the members of St. Patrick's Holy Name Society heard an address by the Rev. William J. Brien, pastor.

Father Brien outlined the history of the Holy Name movement, tracing its origin back to the thirteenth century. By papal decree of Pope Gregory X, the Dominican Friars were charged with spreading devotion to the Holy Name of Christ.

They were urged to set in motion the forces which were aimed to combat atheism, blasphemy, irreligion and disrespect for divine and civil law. Holy Name Society members are asked to strive to achieve the same ends today.

Father Brien concluded his talk by urging the members to be loyal and practical American Catholics, true to their lofty teachings of their church and ever mindful of their Holy Name pledge.

Newly elected officers are: Leo J. Hourihan, president; Peter W. Shields, vice president; James F. Hennessy, Jr., secretary; Charles D. O'Hara, treasurer. Rev. Hubert A. Bisky is spiritual director of the Society.

The members passed a resolution to purchase a Defense Bond in the

name of the Society and also to make a donation to the Red Cross war relief fund.

Movies of parish events, including Father Brien's Silver Jubilee celebration were shown after the meeting.
