

Throng Pays Tribute To Dr. Louis O'Neill

AUBURN.—A throng, including members of the medical profession, outstanding civic and fraternal leaders and the many recipients of his medical skill joined in the final tribute to Dr. Louis F. O'Neill at funeral services held in St. Mary's Church, Jan. 8.

Dr. O'Neill, for many years a leading physician and surgeon in Auburn and widely active in the community, died Jan. 5 at his home, 25 William Street.

Solemn High Mass of Requiem was offered by the Rev. Dr. William E. Cowen with the Rev. Joseph McNamara as Deacon and the Rev. Dennis W. Hickey as Sub-deacon.

The solemn and impressive music was sung by the choir directed by Gerald Conroy.

Burial was in St. Joseph's Cemetery, where Doctor Cowen imparted the final blessing assisted by Fathers Hickey and McNamara.

Bearers were Thomas J. Hennesey, Perry E. Lesty, Charles M. Geherin, Frank S. Smith, James D. Quill and Edward F. Brayer. A delegation of physicians served as honorary escort and other delegations represented the groups with which Dr. O'Neill was affiliated.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Mary Hanlon O'Neill; two brothers, Martin O'Neill of Auburn and Lawrence O'Neill of Syracuse.

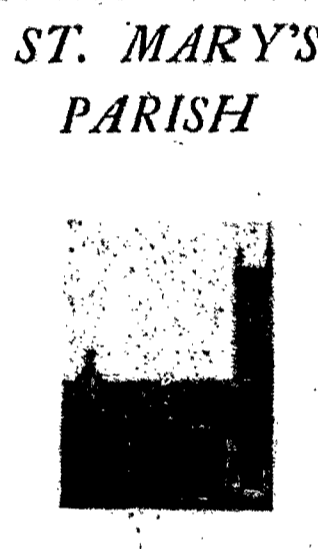
